EAGLE'S NEST GOLF COURSE LOCAL RULES

USGA Rules and Interpretations and the following Local Rules govern play.

1. Out of Bounds: Out of bounds is defined by white stakes, fences, curbs of streets, and homeowner property lines evidenced by the change in landscape rocks. Any ball that enters or crosses a street is out of bounds even if it comes to rest on another part of the course. Rule 18 applies. In casual play, the USGA Model Local Rule E-5 for a ball lost or OB is in effect. If a provisional ball has not been played, for a two-stroke penalty a ball may be dropped not nearer the hole and 1) within two club-lengths of where the ball was likely lost or where it went OB, or 2) within two club-lengths of the nearest edge of the fairway, or 3) anywhere between those two locations.
2. Penalty Areas: All penalty areas are red and will generally be identified by red stakes and/or lines. Rule 17.1d describes relief options available for a one-stroke penalty. In the absence of stakes or lines, the edge of a red penalty area for a lake is defined by the edge of the turf on the course side of the concrete lake liner. a) Two ball dropping zones are provided on hole #4 as an additional option and if the player elects to use a dropping zone, the ball must be dropped in the zone nearer to where the ball last crossed the edge of the red penalty area. b) The Bullard Wash on hole #17 is both a red penalty area and a No Play Zone and is defined by red stakes with green tops. You may not play a ball from that penalty area and must take relief as described under Rule 17.1e or use the drop zone to the right of the cart path about 30 yards short of the green.
3. Abnormal Course Conditions: Relief without penalty is available for interference from abnormal course conditions (ground under repair, temporary water, immovable obstructions, animal holes and a ball embedded in its own pitch mark in the turf). Drop a ball within one club-length of the nearest point of complete relief but never nearer the hole than the ball's original position. Rule 16 applies. Immovable Obstructions include: a) All concrete and asphalt cart paths plus the cart exit path bordered by river rock on hole #10. b) Staked trees and the ropes or wires attached to them. c) The cactus garden in the desert area to the right of hole #18. d) The rocks and plantings within the cart parking turnaround near #18 green. e) Areas of river rock (typically softball-size and larger) arranged for a functional purpose such as drainage or erosion control. f) French drains.
4. Immovable Obstructions Near a Putting Green: Relief from interference by an immovable obstruction may be taken under Rule 16.1. In addition, USGA Model Local Rule F-5 is in effect and the player may take relief, without penalty, under Rule 16.1b if an immovable obstruction intervenes on the line of play and is both within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball.

PEBBLECREEK RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Course Rangers have the authority to enforce all PebbleCreek rules. Repeated violations may lead to removal from the golf course.
2. Proper golf dress is required. No metal spikes allowed.
3. Players may not enter homeowner property to retrieve golf balls.
4. Carts must remain on the cart path on all par 3 holes and any other hole designated as cart path only. Golf carts are never allowed in the desert, on homeowner lots, or in the Bullard Wash.
5. Please fill divots with sand and seed mix, repair ball marks, and rake bunkers.
6. All yardages are measured to the middle of the green.
